

Baby-Friendly Initiative Ontario (BFI Ontario) Terms of Reference 2021

VISION: Ontario has a Baby-Friendly culture.

MISSION: To protect, promote, and support breastfeeding in the province of Ontario through the adoption, implementation and maintenance of the Baby-Friendly Initiative.

GOALS:

- To support the implementation of Baby-Friendly best practices across Ontario.
- To increase the number of hospitals and community health services involved in the implementation of the Baby-Friendly Initiative (BFI).
- To increase the number of BFI designated hospitals and community health services.
- To support Baby-Friendly Initiative designated hospitals and community health services to maintain their Baby-Friendly Initiative designation.

BFI Ontario adopted the BFI Ontario Bylaws in April 2021. Link to the bylaws is http://www.bfiontario.ca/bfi-ontario-by-laws/

The governance of BFI Ontario is the responsibility of the Executive.

- BFI Ontario Executive members are elected at the Annual General Meeting from the BFION members with the exception of the BCC appointed positions (BFI Ontario Assessment Coordinator and BCC Representative).
- Terms of office are staggered to ensure continuity.
- BFI Ontario members may re-elect a member of the Executive for a maximum of 3 consecutive 2-year terms. If no member steps up to fill an Executive position, the residing member may continue to fill that role
- There will be a minimum of four (4) Executive meetings per year.

In addition to the governance of BFI Ontario, the Executive will:

- Create and implement a strategic plan (or logic model)
- Foster ongoing communication and partnerships with key stakeholders

- Engage in partnerships with the provincial government, health care providers, educators, organizations, consumers, and interest groups
- Regularly attend executive meetings, membership meetings and the AGM.
- Prepare a summary of the work completed, in accordance with each executive position, to be included in the Annual Report
- Hold a minimum of four (4) Membership Meetings per year
- Review the Terms of Reference at least every 2 years.

Conflict of Interest

Every member of the BFI Ontario Executive is honour bound to report actual or perceived conflicts of interest (COI) to the co-chairs before or during the meeting where an issue of COI will or may arise. Based on the self-report, the BFI Ontario Executive co-chairs will recommend one of the following courses of action:

• Participate fully with the COI declared

OR

• Contribute to the discussion, but refrain from making recommendations and abstain in the decision-making process
